Who does What Where in Eritrea in 2004

This briefing paper provides a look at humanitarian information gathered through the 'Who does What Where' (W3) survey for 2004. This was initiated by the Eritrean Refugee and Relief Commission (ERREC) and UNOCHA in 2001 to gather essential information on emergency/relief, recovery and development projects in Eritrea.

The survey illustrates the range of projects that are undertaken by diverse international and national agencies in the context of the humanitarian, recovery and development response as reported by the agencies.

How this Report is Organised

The report lists all reported projects, into relief, recovery and development based on the nature of issues they address.

The report also groups the projects by their status into three groups based on whether they are in approved and awaiting funding; under implementation; or completed stages. Within each group, projects are listed by primary sector, although many might contain multilateral elements.

Since many projects have a span of more than one year, the start and completion dates have been indicated for most of the projects. For such projects, the budget part anticipated for the year 2004 has been shown.

The report also includes charts that show a breakdown of projects active during 2004. **The funds reflected in the charts however are not necessarily resourced in 2004; the charts and tables should therefore be viewed with this in mind.**

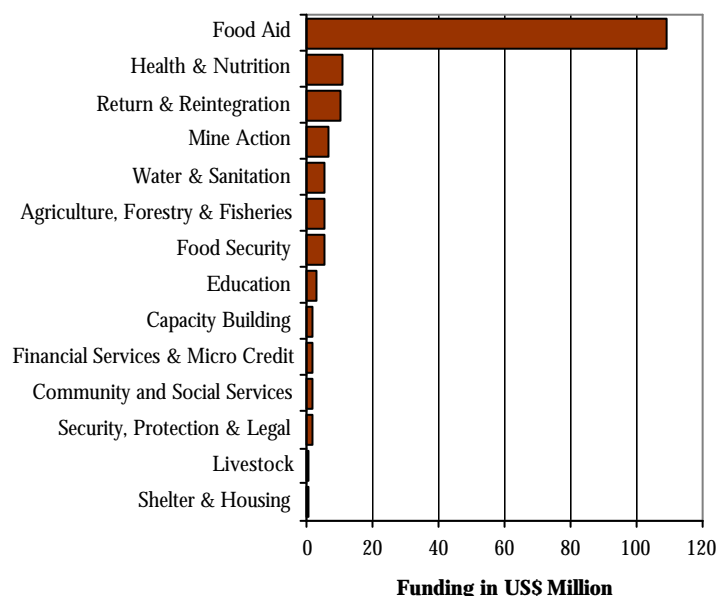

Sectoral Breakdown

Six agencies have been active in the food aid sector in Eritrea. The three main are WFP, CRS and Mercy Corps International. Food aid represents almost 66% of all assistance in the W3 database. (See chart below).

One hundred ninety three projects in the non-food sector comprised of 34% of the total funding in 2004.

Project Status

78% of the total value of the projects reported is being used for projects that are on-going until the reporting date/time (see chart below). Almost 21% of the funds are allocated to 27 projects that were completed earlier in 2004; another 1% of the funds are assigned to projects that are not yet started implementation.

Funds by Project Status

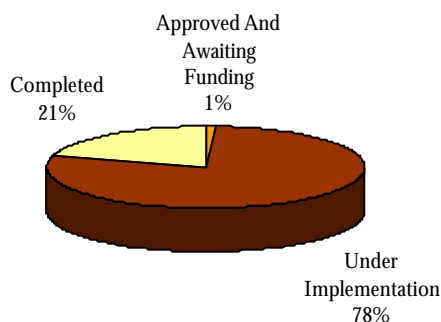


Chart showing the percentage of funds by status

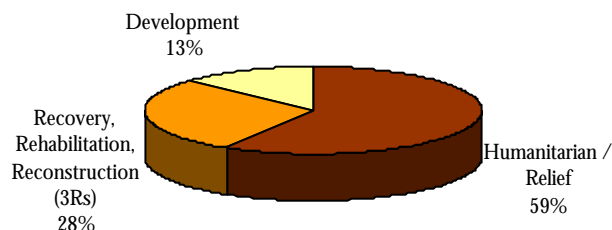
One third of the 27 reported projects that are completed in the year 2004, started in the same year. The rest two third on the other hand had started in the preceding years. Less than half of the 165 projects which are reported “under implementation” in 2004, started in the same year but will end by the year 2004, 2005, and 2006. The rest (89 projects) started before 2004 and will end by the year 2004 and beyond 2004.

Project Type

Emergency/relief projects remain the largest component of the assistance programme, accounting for 59% of the funding (see Chart below). At the same time, a significant number of organisations are branching out into recovery and development with 28% and 13% of the total funding respectively. 25 of the 40 organisations included in the database have humanitarian projects, 21 agencies reported involvement in recovery and 21 in development. It is worth noting that out of the 40 reporting agencies, 15 are involved in any two components of the assistance programme; 6 are active in all three and the remaining in one.

Chart showing the percentage of funds by project type

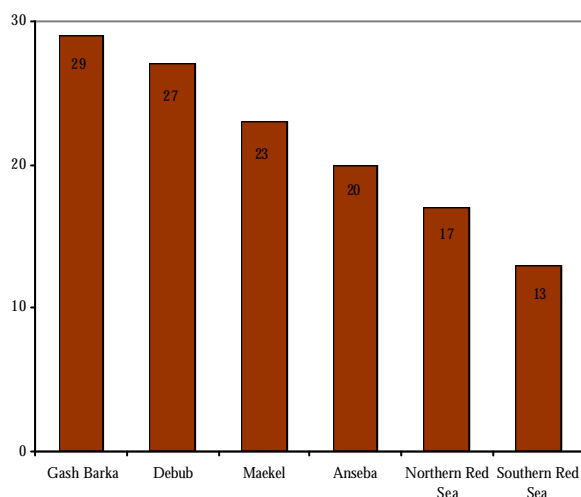
Funds by Project Type



Geographic Presence of Agencies

Although projects are spread in all regions Gash Barka has the largest number of humanitarian agencies followed by Dehub (see chart below). Other zobas also show the presence of at least 13 agencies each.

Many agencies have projects in more than one region covering a large area of the sub-zobas in the respective regions. Few agencies however restrict their activities to a single Sub-Zoba and the majority cover at least two sub-zobas.

Next Steps

The database is now complete under the current scope of international and national agencies in the context of the humanitarian projects active in 2004. However based on the feedback, work will continue to improve the relevance and accuracy of the survey. Further efforts will also be made to refine the quality and accuracy of information gathered from the various agencies.

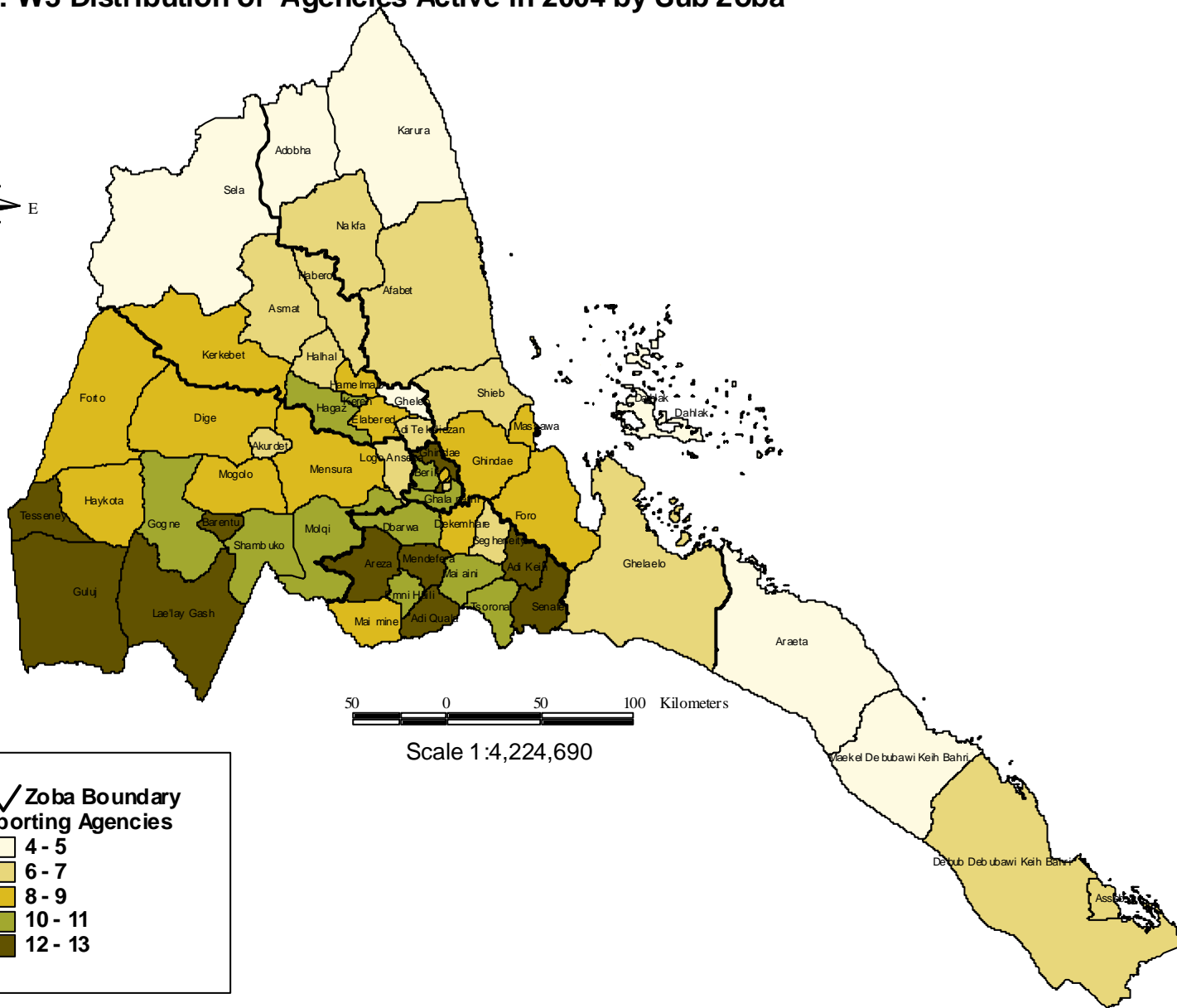
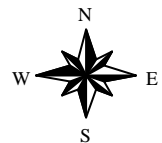

Eritrea: W3 Distribution of Agencies Active in 2004 by Sub Zoba



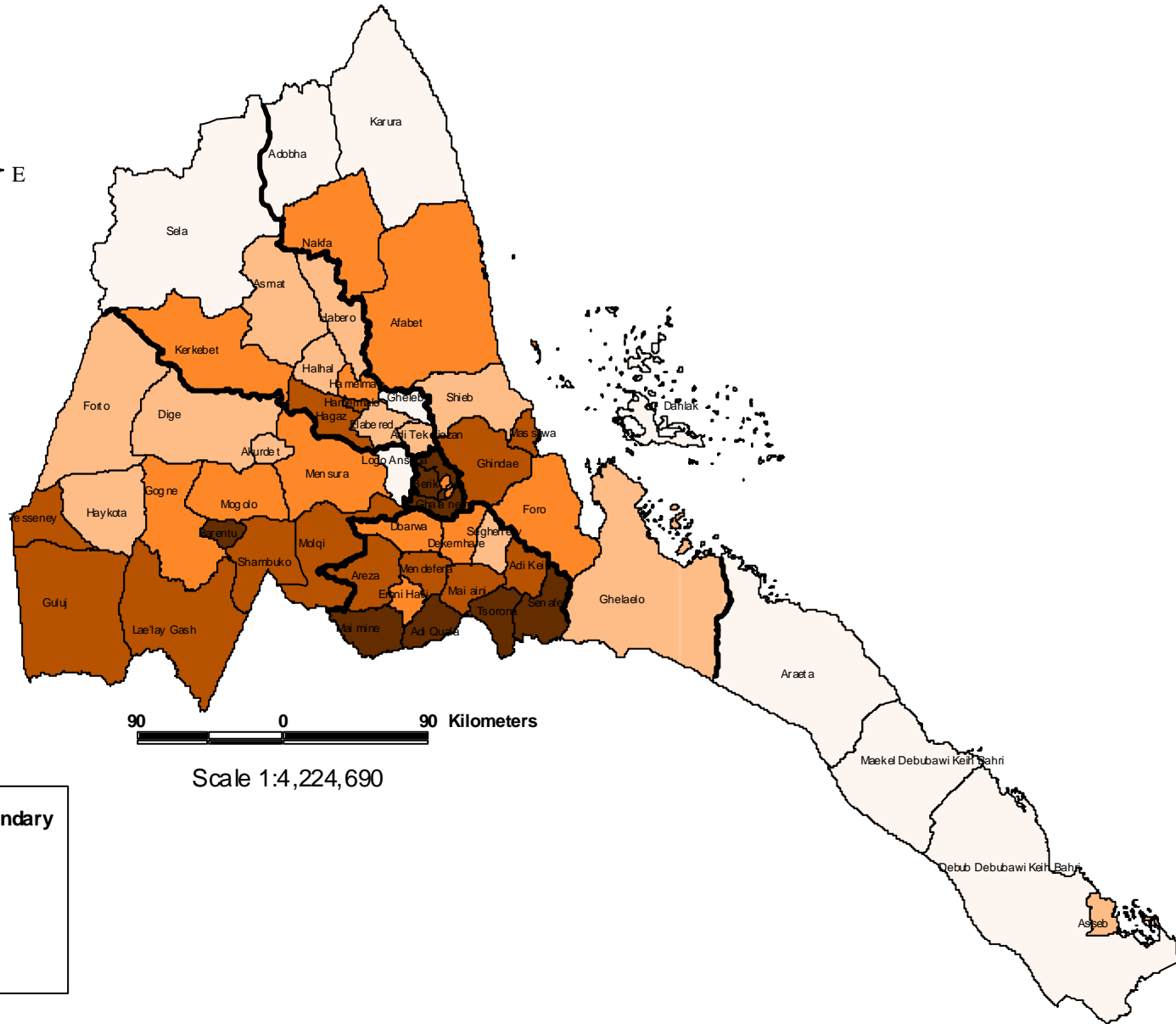
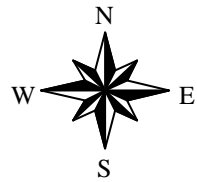
